**Judicial Training Network is
Designed to:**

- Build in-state judicial expertise on the immigration issues and questions arising in state court proceedings
- Provide judge-to-judge support thorough *Judicial Resource Officers* that provide information when judges need it
- Improve access to justice for immigrant children, children in immigrant families and immigrant crime victims

Grant Term and Trainings

- 2017 through the spring of 2021
- 3 Multi-state trainings
 - 2018 – New Mexico - completed
 - 2019 – New Orleans
 - 2020 – Mississippi



Trainings

- Annual trainings in each state designed to
 - Meet the needs of state court judges
 - Reach judges who most need the information
 - Over time reach significant numbers of judges who see in court
 - Immigrant children
 - Immigrant crime victims
 - Children in immigrant families
- Open to more than one per year if staffing with judicial faculty possible



State Judicial Trainers

- Year one in-state trainings national faculty
- State judicial leadership team choice year 2 and 3
 - In state trainings combined national and state judicial faculty
 - As state judges gain knowledge of the curriculum state judges take over training with support of national faculty



Judge-to-Judge Technical Assistance Judicial Resource Officers

- One-on-one technical assistance to judges who
 - Need assistance with cases
 - Have questions they would like answered
- Delivered by state leadership team judges
 - Delivery system developed in each state
 - With back up of national partners and national judicial experts



Improving Access to Justice for Immigrant Children, Immigrant Crime Victims and Children in Immigrant Families

- NGO Partners
 - Outreach to programs serving immigrant and LEP children, victims, and families
 - Identify barriers to accessing the courts
 - Meet with court partner and state judicial leadership team to develop and implement plans for improving access to justice
 - Carry out plan collaborating with other NGOs in the state



Improving Access to Justice for Immigrant Children, Immigrant Crime Victims and Children in Immigrant Families

- Court Partners and Judicial Leadership Team
 - Meet with NGO partners to discuss barriers to access to justice for immigrant and LEP litigants
 - Identify areas in which local courts and courts statewide could implement improvements
 - Identify ways courts can work with NGO partners
 - Develop and implement a work plan for implementing identified improvements
