Thank you for your July 27, 2010 letter regarding proposed changes to the Performance Based National Detention Standard on Escorted Trips for Non-Medical Emergencies.

Please be assured that U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) will give your recommendations full consideration. I share your belief that parents have a fundamental right to care for their children and participate in the discussions and decisions that affect the interest of their child. As you note in your letter, ICE has taken extraordinary measures to ensure that detained parents are provided access to family court proceedings, so that they may exercise their parental rights. I will review your other proposals to see what additional changes might be viable.
