## **Vera Institute of Justice: Bridging Police and Communities**

Susan Shah and Dr. Rebecca Neusteter are leading the effort to expand <u>Vera's policing</u> footprint through:

- 1. Guiding and supporting police to address community problems beyond making arrests &
- 2. Facilitating meaningful dialogue and collaboration between police and dedicated and informed community members

Vera believes the best way to change police responses is to develop a new model for police decision-making and performance evaluation. Check out their <u>CompStat 2.0</u>, which is doing exactly this. Vera will be piloting this new model in a number of places around the country in 2018.

Additionally, Vera has a new initiative called PEACE: Police Enhancing Accountability through Community Engagement. PEACE will structure and support police and community stakeholders in developing and/or rethinking police policies around topics that are often at the center of conflict and hardship.
