Class Preference Defined:

H-1B: Is a non-immigrant visa in the United States under the Immigration and Nationality Act, section 101(a)(15)(H). It allows U.S. employers to temporarily employ foreign workers in specialty occupations.
L-1A: Nonimmigrant classification enables a U.S. employer to transfer an executive or manager from one of its affiliated foreign offices to one of its offices in the United States.
L-1B: Nonimmigrant classification enables a U.S. employer to transfer a professional employee with specialized knowledge relating to the organization's interests from one of its affiliated foreign offices to one of its offices in the United States
O-1: USICS Data not distinguished by subcategory
O-1A: Individuals with an extraordinary ability in the sciences, education, business, or athletics (not including the arts, motion pictures or television industry)
O-1B: Individuals with an extraordinary ability in the arts or extraordinary achievement in motion picture or television industry.
O-2: Individuals who will accompany an O-1, artist or athlete, to assist in a specific event or performance.
