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Federal Definition of Human Trafficking

- **Sex Trafficking** – the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, obtaining, patronizing, or soliciting of a person for the purpose of a commercial sex act which is induced by **force, fraud, or coercion**, or in which the person induced to perform such act has not attained 18 years of age; or
- **Labor Trafficking** – the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of **force, fraud or coercion**, for the purpose of subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage or slavery.

Warning Signs that an Individual is Being Trafficked	Human Trafficking Statistics
● Signs of physical abuse ● Unexplained absences from class ● Overly sexualized behavior, dressing more provocatively ● Withdrawn, depressed, distracted, or checked out ● Brags about making lots of money or displays new, expensive possessions ● Tattoos can be used to brand victims. (Tattoos of names, money symbols, barcodes) ● Shows signs of gang affiliation: always wearing specific colors, talking about new group of friends, drawing gang symbols, etc. ● Has no control over their own money or identification documents ● Might show signs of substance use ● Individual appears timid, fearful, or submissive ● Individual appears to have been coached on what to say ● Individual shows signs of having been denied food, water, sleep, or medical care ● Individual shows sudden or dramatic change in behavior	● 1/3 of runaway teens become involved in sex trafficking within 48 hours of leaving home, meaning about 150,000 children are pulled into prostitution each year. ● In 2014, 396 survivors of human trafficking came into contact with the Maryland Human Trafficking Task Force. 381 of those were victims of sex trafficking, and 364 of those were girls and women. ● As of 2019, Maryland ranks 4th in human trafficking per capita. Major interstate highways, airports, and mix of wealth and poverty makes vulnerable youth in MD especially susceptible to trafficking.
