## Iowa (2021)\*

- Total foreign born population 173,021
- \* 5.4% of the state's ~ 3.2 million people are foreign born
  - 48.9% naturalized citizens
  - 32% legal permanent residents (as of 2019)
  - 19.1% temporary visa holders or undocumented immigrants
- 90% rise in immigrant population from 2000 to 2021
- \*Length of time immigrants have lived in the U.S.
  - 35.4% entered before 1999
  - 26.8% entered 2000 2009
  - $_{\circ}~$  37.8% since 2010
- 12.8% of children under age 18 have one or more immigrant parents
  - $_{\circ}~$  85.7% of these children are native-born U.S. citizens
