## Maine (2021)\*

- Total foreign born population 56,068
- 4.1% of the country's ~ 1.4 million people are foreign born
  - 56.2% naturalized citizens
  - 30% legal permanent residents (as of 2019)
  - 13.8% temporary visa holders or undocumented immigrants
- 52.8% rise in immigrant population from 2000 to 2021

\*Length of time immigrants have lived in the U.S.

- $\circ$  46.5% entered before 1999
- 16.7% entered 2000 2009
- 36.8% since 2010
- 8.3% of children under age 18 have one or more immigrant parents
  - $_{\circ}~$  83.2% of these children are native-born U.S. citizens
