Legal Services (Legal Aid) Organizations:

There are 132 legal offices throughout the United States that provide free legal services to eligible low-income clients. Legal Services offices can help with employment claims among many other issues like divorces, child custody arrangements, protective orders, landlord-tenant disputes, federally subsidized housing, public benefits, consumer disputes, wills and more.

United States Department of Labor – Wage & Hour Division

U.S. Equal Employment Opportunities Commission (EEOC)

The EEOC enforces federal laws prohibiting employment discrimination such as unfair treatment or harassment because of your race, color, religion, sex (including pregnancy, gender identity, and sexual orientation), national origin, age (40 or older) or disability.

Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA)

OSHA establishes and enforces federal laws that require employers to ensure that workplaces are free from known health and safety hazards, that workers are provided safety gear and protective equipment and that employers limit hazards from chemicals used in the work, among other things. OSHA can conduct workplace inspections and respond to complaints by workers of unsafe working conditions.
