The goals of this training will be to ensure that attendees will be better able to screen and serve survivors eligible for immigration relief (VAWA, T visa, U visa, and SIJS) using a trauma-informed approach while improving survivor safety and economic security. The training will provide tips and tools for expanding access to family law protections, SIJS judicial determinations, and all of the state and federal benefits and services immigrant survivors are eligible to receive in Hawaii. The training will highlight trafficking co-occurring with domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and child abuse.
