With the help of your case manager:



Apply for a non-work Social Security Number (SSN)

- **Visit <u>ssa.gov/locator</u> or call 1-800-772-1213** to find your nearest Social Security Administration (SSA) office. *You may need to make an appointment.
- When you go to the SSA office, bring:
 - Original Eligibility Letter or Interim Assistance Letter (required)
 - Birth Certificate (recommended)
 - Photo ID, like a state ID, non-expired passport, or school ID (recommended)

Apply for benefits and services

- Visit local benefit-issuing agencies
- When you go to an office or agency, bring:
 - Original Eligibility Letter or Interim Assistance Letter (required)
 - Non-work Social Security ID (required)
 - Proof of household income for all working household members (required)
 - Photo ID, like a state ID, non-expired passport, or school ID (recommended)

^{*}You may not be eligible for all benefits, and some benefits are time-limited. See other side for details.

You may be eligible for these programs:



• <u>Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP)</u>: Assistance program used like cash to pay for food at most grocery stores



• <u>Supplemental Security Income (SSI)</u>: Cash assistance to meet basic needs (food, shelter, and clothing) for people who are blind, aged, or have a disability and have little or no income and resources.

- <u>Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)</u>: Cash and work opportunities for families and children under 18 years old.
- <u>Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA)</u>: Time-limited cash assistance for refugees and other special populations who are not eligible for SSI or TANF. *RCA is only available for up to 8 months following your Benefits Start Date.



Health Insurance and Medical Services

- Medicaid: Health coverage for people with low income and limited resources.
- <u>Refugee Medical Assistance (RMA)</u>: Time-limited medical help for refugees and other special populations who are not eligible for Medicaid. *RMA is only available for up to 8 months following your Benefits Start Date.
- <u>Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)</u>: Health insurance for low-income, uninsured children under 18 years old.
- Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) Medical Screenings: Health screenings, diagnosis, treatment, and preventative care.



• <u>Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)</u>: Help with substance use and mental illness.



• <u>Title IV Federal Student Financial Aid (FAFSA)</u>: Grants, loans, and work study to help pay for education.



Employment

- Job Corps: Career training program for youth 16 to 24 years old.
- Refugee Support Services: Services include English language training, vocational training, and job placement and retention.



- <u>Public Housing Program</u>: Affordable housing for low-income families & individuals.
- <u>Housing Choice Voucher Program</u>: Housing voucher program to help low-income families and individuals pay rent.



• <u>Unaccompanied Refugee Minors Program (URM)</u>: Foster care for unaccompanied refugee minors and other special youth populations in the United States.
